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### **INTERPRETATION GUIDE:**

### 0-10 Points: DIY MAY BE SAFE

Your estate appears straightforward. Consider initial attorney consultation (\$400-800) for roadmap, then handle administration yourself with guidance.

### 11-25 Points: LIMITED SCOPE RECOMMENDED

Your estate has moderate complexity. Hire attorney for specific high-risk tasks while handling routine administration yourself. See Limited Scope Services Matrix.

### 26+ Points: FULL REPRESENTATION REQUIRED

Your estate complexity makes DIY dangerous. Attorney fees (\$5,000-15,000) are insurance against mistakes costing \$50,000+. See Attorney Interview Questions.

### ATTORNEY COST-BENEFIT CALCULATOR

Calculate whether attorney fees provide value through mistake prevention specific to YOUR estate.

### **DECISION FRAMEWORK:**

If your estimated mistake risk exceeds attorney fees, representation provides positive financial value. If mistake risk is minimal and attorney fees seem high relative to estate value, limited scope or DIY may be appropriate.

# **⚠ RED FLAG QUICK REFERENCE ⚠**

### STOP & HIRE ATTORNEY IF:

- X Anyone challenges the will or your appointment
- X Estate value exceeds \$2M or estate tax threshold
- X Decedent owned any business interest or partnership
  - Real estate in multiple states (ancillary probate)
- X Beneficiaries disagree about distributions or valuations
  - X You're uncertain about your legal authority to act
  - X Potential wrongful death or malpractice claims exist
  - X You're uncomfortable with legal forms or procedures
    - X Your state legally requires attorney representation

### **REMEMBER:**

Attorney fees (\$3K-\$10K) prevent mistakes costing \$50K+ When in doubt, get the consultation (\$400-\$800)
