

## Solidified Remains FAQ

### What Families Need to Know

*Answers to the most common questions about transforming cremation ashes into holdable, shareable stones through Parting Stone.*

#### **Can I solidify remains that have been stored for years?**

Yes. There is no time limit. Whether cremation happened last week or a decade ago, the process works the same way.

#### **How many stones will my family receive?**

Most families receive 40 to 80+ individual stones from one set of human remains. Each stone is unique in color and shape.

#### **Is this real science or a novelty product?**

The patented process was independently validated by Los Alamos National Laboratory. Stones are permanent, ceramic-like solids that will not dissolve or degrade.

#### **What does it cost?**

Human remains: \$2,495 all-inclusive (collection kit, shipping both ways, processing). Dogs: \$995. Cats: \$795. Visit the link below for current pricing details.

#### **How long does the process take?**

Approximately 84 days from order placement. If a specific date matters to your family, factor in the processing window when deciding.

#### **Can we send only a portion of the ashes?**

Yes. Partial solidification is available. You can solidify most of the remains and keep or scatter the rest. Note: solidification is not reversible.

#### **Can two people's remains be combined?**

Yes. A co-mingling option combines remains of two loved ones (such as spouses) into one unified stone collection.

#### **Is there a pre-need option for advance planning?**

Yes. Pre-Need Plans lock in current pricing and remove the decision burden from your family. Available since October 2025.
