## AARP Membership FAQ

What Families Need to Know

*A quick, honest reference to settle the AARP question at the kitchen table.*

### What does it cost?

\$15 your first full year with automatic renewal, then \$20 a year. A free second household membership is included, so a couple is covered for one fee.

### Is it worth it for us?

For most people over 50, yes. One hotel discount, a few member meals, or an hour of clear Medicare help covers the year, fastest near Medicare, caregiving, or estate planning.

### Am I locked in if I auto-renew?

No. Auto-renewal is what unlocks the \$15 rate, but you can switch to manual renewal in your account and cancel at any time.

### What do we actually get?

Medicare guidance, the Fraud Watch helpline, a free will tool and estate guides, caregiving resources, and 200-plus discounts on travel, dining, and prescriptions.

### Can I get it for a parent?

Yes. You can buy a gift membership for anyone 50 or older, and the free second membership covers a spouse at the same address.

### Does AARP take political sides?

AARP is nonpartisan but advocates on Social Security, Medicare, and drug-pricing legislation. Worth knowing before you join.
